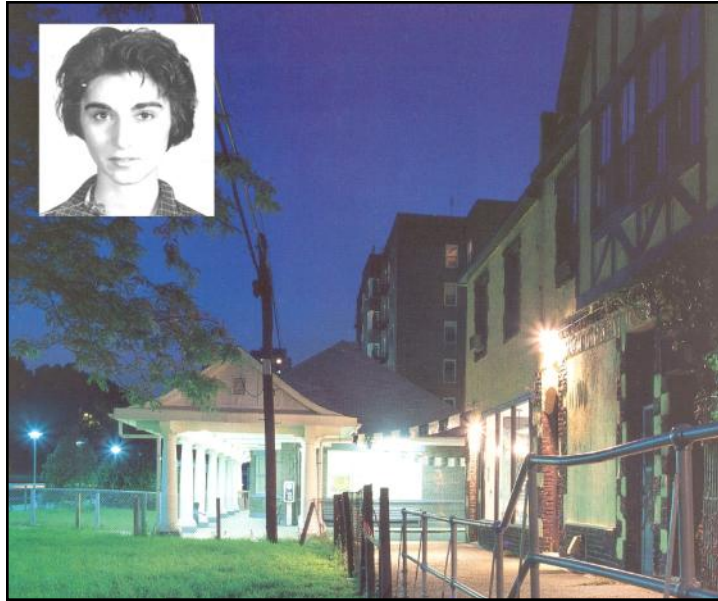

## **The Murder of Kitty Genovese:** What You Think You Know About the Case Might Not be True
